Last Sunday over 30 people were in attendance in our Sanctuary as Reverend Tom Hiller lead us in a Service of the Word and Sacrament. Music was heard, with Sheila Clausen on the piano, along with four Choir members singing the liturgy. The congregation continues to follow our safety protocols by sitting in family groups, socially distant from one another and remaining masked and not singing during service.

We will **NOT** be holding service this Sunday (9/5) during Labor Day weekend, but will return the following Sunday, September 12 to celebrate God's Work, Our Hands Sunday with special music and a message by guest T.J. Putman of Family Promise/IHN, followed by a walk over to the Easter House for a prayerful blessing as it transitions to a new chapter in its life.

Please observe Labor Day safely and honor all those who work. Not only those in our community but also at home and your church. Perhaps God is calling you to assist those that volunteer doing the required tasks at church. Many people are needed to prepare the Holy Cross for service, both inside and out. Consider joining us on Tuesday mornings in the office or around the building and grounds. If musically inclined, the Voice and Bell Choirs are starting rehearsals on Wednesday evenings. Maybe your talents lean towards A/V equipment, computers, or social media, then the Tech Team could use you! Opportunities await, just call the church office for details.

Pastor Charles Mantey at St. Mark's Lutheran Church continues to provide pastoral care for our members during this time of transition. Please route all communication through Janet or me so we can keep track of what is going on with our church family.

The Property Committee is reviewing the proposal from Mano a Mano to lease space for a parenting childhood development program that they have received a grant for. This requires devoting more space than they are currently using and may impact other programs and groups we host at our church. Contact Janet or me with any questions or concerns you have about expanding the space we are leasing in the building.

Calling all Youth. If you are or know of someone in middle or high school your church wants you! We are again partnering with St. Mark's and Christ the Good Shepherd for youth activities. Please give your contact information to the church office so we can coordinate planning.

Also, if you are aware of someone needing to go through confirmation (typically grades 6-8th), please let the office know. Pastor Charles has graciously offered to assist the other two churches as they both are going through transition.

Your church council continues to work with the Bishop's Associate for Intercultural and Inter-religious Mission, Juan Carlos La Puente Tapia on our possible Interim Pastor. All parties agree that she could be a good fit for us, and we are working to define the flexibility she would require in her schedule to lessen the administrative burden to allow for time for the discernment process to discover where the Holy Spirit is leading us both now and in the future.

The Synod would like us to form a cohort to work with the Interim and the Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon on the initiative of "Reckoning with Racism". This program has "accompanied various faith communities around the state as they grapple with Oregon's legacy of racism in a process of learning, listening, and engaging. In addition to learning from a broader range of community partners about their unique experience of life here in Oregon, we will deepen our understanding of the complex and intersectional truths they unveil and accompany faith communities as they discern what repair and reconciliation looks like in their local context."

Is this something that you could support and be involved in? How do you think it affects Holy Cross and the possible benefits that could be gained during this time of discernment and transition? Your thoughts are appreciated as the council ponders accepting this initiative as part of the transition journey.

Continue to pray for healing during the pandemic. Continue to reach out and help those that are in need, both physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Please pray for your leadership as they make decisions concerning the short- and long-term future of Holy Cross Lutheran Church.
