Holy Cross Lutheran Church **WILL** be holding in-person services this Sunday, February 6, 2022, at 10:00 AM. While there is still a bit of a debate on whether Oregon has reached the crest of the recent Omicron COVID wave, there is a sense that the worst may have passed and we can meet safely, IF we continue to take precautions.

Again, we will have Pastor Curtis Zieske on hand to lead us in the Sacrament of Holy Communion and a couple members of choir will sing the liturgy. Most importantly, after three weeks of not holding in-person services, we can return to the habit of attending worship and joining our fellow church family members in the body of Christ. It is important that we keep our connections strong and communing together is a very big step in uniting in our faith journey.

We will continue to wear masks and sit socially distant in the pews. The congregation will not sing, and we will not have any fellowship time with coffee or cookies following service. If you do not feel well, please stay home and seek medical care if needed. We will be recording the service and posting it to our YouTube channel on Monday.

Despite not holding worship in-person last week, I hope you were able to view the short recordings of the Prayers and Readings of the Day, along with a sermon from Pastor Zieske.
